Scenario: I have finished my annotated bibliography assignment. My friend in another section has not started yet, but the due date is close. I would like to help, so I lend my assignment to him/her.

- jointly producing an assignment by two or more students and presenting it as your own work;
- lending your work to (an)other student(s); or
- allowing (an)other student(s) to copy your work.

4.2 Ghost writing

Scenario: My English is not good. I know that my grade in EAW is really important for Non-Jupas application. There are lots of essay-writing agencies. I decide to hire someone to write my essay.

• Having someone do the work (partially or in full) on your behalf.

4.3 Essay and paper mills

Scenario: AI tools are very assessable now. The University also encourages us to explore the use of AI in learning, so I think it is fine to use text-generated AI tool to write my essay. I use POS to generate my EAW essay outline and Claude to generate my term essay.

 Purchasing or downloading ready-made/machine-generated assignments from websites/online platforms that sell and compile assignments.

4.4 Plagiarism

Scenario: The argument in the core article is highly convincing. I copy a few of the exact sentences from the article but I do not acknowledge the source.

• Taking words or ideas from their rightful owners and presenting them as if they were your own.

4.5 Cheating

Scenario: E-forum is an open-book assessment, and we are allowed to use dictionaries too.

During the in-class assessment, I send the E-forum question to my friend via WhatsApp. H/She writes the E-forum response for me. I then copy and paste the text to the forum.

• Unauthorised using of resources and/or any prohibited tools during the examination.



i. What is the accuracy of Turnitin's AI writing indicator?

We strive to maximize the effectiveness of our detector while keeping our false positive rate - incorrectly identifying fully human-written text as AI-generated - <u>under 1% for documents with over 20% of AI writing. In other words, we might flag a human-written document as AI-written for one out of every 100 fully-human written documents.</u>

To bolster our testing framework and diagnose statistical trends of false positives, in April 2023 we performed additional tests on 800,000 additional academic papers that were written before the release of ChatGPT to further validate our less than 1% false positive rate.

In order to maintain this low rate of 1% for false positives, there is a chance that we might miss 15% of AI written text in a document. We're comfortable with that since we do not want to incorrectly highlight human-written text as AI-written. For example, if we identify that 50% of a document is likely written by an AI tool, it could contain as much as 65% AI writing.

ii. If students use **Grammarly** for grammar checks, does Turnitin detect it and flag it as AI?

NO. Our detector is <u>not tuned to target Grammarly-generated spelling, grammar, and punctuation modifications to content</u> but rather, other AI content written by LLMs such as GPT-3.5. Based on initial tests we conducted on human-written documents with no AI-generated content in them, in most cases, changes made by Grammarly (free & premium) and/or other grammar-checking tools were not flagged as AI-written by our detector. Please note that this excludes GrammaryGo, which is a generative AI writing tool and as such content produced using this tool will likely be flagged as AI-generated by our detector.
